The mobility project developed within Leonardo da Vinci Programme

“New competence of persons in charge of data protection enforcement activity”

The purpose of the “New competence of persons in charge of data protection enforcement activity” project developed within the Leonardo da Vinci Programme aims at enabling employees of the Bureau of the Inspector General for Personal Data Protection from Poland to broaden their knowledge and acquire new experience and information concerning the application of data protection legislation by the other authorities dealing with the similar issues. Participants of the exchange will be given a chance to get acquainted in details with both general issues connected with data protection authorities’ activity and specialist issues in this field, according to work being performed.

The programme of the visit will be individually tailored to meet the needs of participating persons and those particular needs related to the nature of work. 1 or 2-week stays are scheduled. During the stay the trainees will get opportunities to gain knowledge on the working conditions and environment in the partner’s office using the following techniques: work observation, exchange of experience, discussions, workshops, presentations, talks with persons responsible for implementation of particular areas of law.

As the result, the project will benefit to broadening of knowledge and skills on the application of EU legislation, exchange of experience concerning data protection authorities’ activity, implementation of practices being applied in a partner’s country into the Polish system, increase a vocational mobility, participation in the lifelong learning and improvement of language skills.

The partners in the project are the public data protection authorities from 6 partner countries: Czech Republic, France, Ireland, Germany, United Kingdom and Finland.
